




This self-guided walking tour is based on the Native American Public Art project

1st stop: **Rick Bartow** (Wiyot) sculpture **SW** 5th & **Taylor**





A coyote "trickster" carries several animals on its back. A grandmother with a tribal tattoo overlooks a baby in a basket.




